1.	Welcome

Laura Naish opened the meeting & welcomed attendees. She confirmed that we are now an MNVP, so we will be working toward incorporating the neonatal voice into all the work we do, we have had our funding confirmed for 2024/25

Welcome to Alix – new chair for St Richards & the Chichester area **Alix James** introduced herself

2. Feedback

Above & Beyond – Feedback for the Trust from our survey, walk the patch and community engagement Alix James shared feedback for St Richards Jordon Clarke shared feedback for Princess Royal & Worthing Laura Naish shared feedback for Royal Sussex County

3. Annual Work Plan

Laura Naish shared the 2024/25 work plan - see slides

We expanded on the conversation around the importance of integrating the neonatal voice and some of the nuanced issues

5. Trust Update

Emma Chambers – Director of Midwifery

- Press coverage It's a difficult time with current press coverage, Emma & Laura are working together on a response to provide some support and reassurance
- Family & Friends Test responses recommendation rate is higher than average
- Maternity survey UHSussex scores wereabout middle of the road compared the other Trusts
- Working to improve communications and learn from service users' experiences
- **CNST** successful in achieving this year's actions
- **Staffing** issues ongoing nationally, all student midwives can be offered a role, most students decide to stay with the Trust. Vacancy is currently at 10%
- Support worker banding uplifted
- **Triage** Implemented centralised triage line across the 4 sites, specially trained midwives that can focus on taking calls with no other responsibilities
- RSCH piloting separate theatre for elective caesareans
- **Estates** Space is an ongoing issue which is a barrier to providing care in the way they would like it. This is the main barrier to providing an MLU, which is still a high priority
- Home Birth Team New team across RSCH & PRH will hopefully reduce service suspensions
- Mortality & brain injury rates are reducing due to the improvements being implemented from saving babies lives, rates are well below national rates – 97% compliant with the care bundle. The 3% is obstetric scanning due to a national sonographer shortage.
